# University at a Glance

#### The University: A Brief History

Aliah University has with it a rich heritage of Mohammedan College of Calcutta, popularly known as Madrasah-i-Aliah or Calcutta Madrasah, which was the first educational institution set up in British India in 1780 by Warren Hastings, the then Governor-General of India. Calcutta Madrasah was upgraded to Calcutta Madrasah College on 22 February, 2006 and then to Aliah University by the Government of West Bengal through Aliah University Act XXVII of 2007 passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly.

The university offers 36 academic programmes under 22 different Departments spread over its three impressive academic campuses. All the Programmes in Science, Engineering and Management run by the University are being held at the New Town campus at II-A/27, New Town, Rajarhat, Kolkata-156. The University also has its administrative section in the New Town campus. All Humanities and Social Science programmes are being held at Park Circus Campus at 17, Gorachand Road, Kolkata-700014. The old premises of erstwhile Calcutta Madrasah College at 21, Haji Md. Mohsin Square, Kolkata-700 016 are mainly used to conduct courses on Religious Studies (Islamic Theology) and the Bachelor of Education programme.

A brief look at the long history and evolution of this Institution may offer us an insight into its great cultural and social importance. Calcutta Madrasah was established chiefly for the study of the Arabic and Persian languages and Muslim Law so that the sons of the Muslim gentry could perform the duties as officers for running the revenue administration and judiciary. The Naib Nizam was instructed to recruit the students of the Madrasah as vacancies occurred in the Fauzdari Courts, on production of certificates of efficiency. However, within a decade Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, Astronomy, Islamic Theology, Oriental Studies, Natural Philosophy, Geological Studies, Law, Logic, Rhetoric, Grammar, and Oratory were added to the list of prescribed subjects for study. In 1821, the Annual Examination of the Madrasah was held in the presence of many respectable officials and academic luminaries of Calcutta. This was the first public examination held in British India.

A medical class, headed by Dr. Peter Breton, Professor of Medicine, was started at this Madrasah in 1826 for the first time in British India. Dr. Breton was authorized to purchase a skeleton and collect medical books. An anatomical work published by John Taylor was arranged to be translated into Arabic. The medical class continued here till the establishment of Calcutta Medical College in 1836. However, the students of the Madrasah were allowed to study medicine at Calcutta Medical College. This speaks for the high standard of education at the Madrasah in those days. Also, the curricula taught at this institution were a blend of theological studies, natural sciences, and the humanities, as was done in the world-wide Madrasah system of education which produced the galaxy of scholars who made original contributions to astronomy, mathematics, chemistry, physics, medicine, geology, art and architecture, and so on. The authorities tried to introduce English as a subject for study in 1826. But, not many students were found willing to learn English, as Persian was still the medium of administration in India.

However, in 1837 the colonial government replaced Persian with English as the official language. So the Anglo-Arabic Department was opened at the Madrasah in 1839 for the teaching of English. At the recommendation of a Committee, again in 1854, this Anglo-Arabic Department was abolished and an English school, in the name of Anglo-Persian Department, was started under the direct control of the Principal of Calcutta Madrasah. The great reformist Nawab Abdul Latif (1828-1893), an alumni of Calcutta Madrasah, played an important role in the establishment of this Department so that Muslim children could receive the much-needed English education. After the Great Rebellion or the so-called 'Sepoy Mutiny' of 1857, the British rulers began to have a suspicious attitude to the Muslims. Questions were raised regarding the maintenance of Calcutta Madrasah at Government cost. There were proposals to abolish the Madrasah, at least the Arabic Department, retaining only the Anglo-Persian Department. However, in 1860, the Government of India, rejecting the idea of abolition, rather recommended improvement in its management. So the Madrasah continued to exist.

In 1869, a Committee consisting of C.H. Campbell, Commissioner of the Presidency Division, I. Suitcliff, Principal of Presidency College, and Nawab Abdul Latif, then a Deputy Magistrate, was formed to inquire into the affairs of the Madrasah and suggest improvement. Some reforms were introduced at the Calcutta Madrasah according to the suggestions of this committee. Further reforms were introduced at the recommendations of the Education Commission headed by W.W. Hunter in 1884. Nawab Abdul Latif and Justice Syed Amir Ali played a very important role in these reforms. In 1896, Elliot Hostel was founded, with funds raised out of donations from the public, for the accommodation of the Madrasah students who so far had used the ground floor of the Madrasah as their hostel. In 1902 the Muslim Institute was established as a part and parcel of Calcutta Madrasah. The Principal of the Madrasah was ex-officio President and Treasurer of the Muslim Institute. Several committees and commissions were appointed in 1915, 1923, 1931, 1938-40, and 1946 for the improvement in the syllabi, curricula, and all round development of Madrasah education in Bengal, particularly of Calcutta Madrasah.

After the Partition of India in 1947, all the movable properties including the library with its thousands of rare books and manuscripts were transferred to Dacca Madrasah, threatening the very existence of the institution. Then Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first Education Minister of independent India, took the initiative to reopen Calcutta Madrasah on 4 April 1949. In 2001 the Madrasah Education Committee headed by the then Governor of West Bengal and noted educationist Professor A. R. Kidwai, made many far-reaching recommendations for its reorganization including the proposal of recognizing Calcutta Madrasah as a Deemed University. Finally, after much debate, the Aliah University Act was passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly in 2007. The University started its glorious journey from the 2008-09 academic session.

#### Vision of the University

Aliah University is marching on with a vision to recapture the ambience and dynamic cultural heritage of the Madrasah system, to expand and deepen it, to evolve it further with a successful outreach into the emerging areas in each branch of modern science, technology, social studies, and

humanities. It aims to instill the dynamism of its glorious heritage of the past among all its students, so that they can successfully cope with the critical needs and challenges of the present and contribute to the future advancement of science, technology, and human civilization. It also hopes to develop in its students the love and respect for the fellow citizens of the country and to cherish the ideals of secularism and national integrity.

#### Mission of the University

- To encourage the study of modern scientific, technological and professional subjects to remain attuned to the needs of the 21st century globalized society.
- To promote innovations and restructuring of existing courses of Islamic Theology and Arabic by incorporating new advances and modernized components in these subjects, and to introduce new courses like Islamic Studies, Islamic Finance and Banking and Islamic Insurance.
- To introduce new methods of teaching and learning in different areas of study to meet the intellectual and educational challenges of the contemporary fast-changing world.
- To take required steps for the introduction of interdisciplinary studies in tune with the present-day global trends in education and research.
- > To facilitate ethical as well as professional improvement and an integral development of personality of the students of the university.
- > To promote humanism, secularism, national integration and international understanding through academic courses, seminars, symposia, conferences and praxis.

#### From the Office of the Vice-Chancellor

An overview of the achievements and activities of the University: 2018

Aliah University – a State University under the Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education, Government of West Bengal – came into existence through the Aliah University Act (Act XXVII of 2007) passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly. The Act came into force on 5 April 2008. Aliah University was upgraded from Calcutta Madrasah College and started its glorious journey from the 2008-09 academic session. This University functions with a main objective to promote higher education amongst the Minority communities of the State of West Bengal.

- Two state of the art Students' Amenity Centres (one at Park Circus campus and the other at New Town Campus) of this University were inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Minister-In-Charge, MA and ME Department, Government of West Bengal on 06.03.2019.
- 2. The University presently has 23 academic departments and offers 46 different academic programmes in Science, Engineering, Islamic Theology, Language, Social Studies, Management, Law, Nursing, BEd and Journalism and Mass Communication.
- 3. UGC has approved the 12B status to Aliah University.
- 4. Among other academic achievements by the faculty members, Dr. Hedayetulla Mir has been awarded with Outstanding Scientist Award, VIRA 2018. Dr. Md. Maidul Islam has been awarded Outstanding Faculty Award from Venus International Research Foundation.
- 5. Seven students of WBCS Coaching secured WBCS Main 2017 Group C service, declared by PSC on 27.02.2019.
- 6. Total no. of On Campus, Pool Campus and Off Campus Drive conducted by Training and Placement Cell in 2018-19 is 44.
- 7. For the first time, this year 9 (nine) students from the Department of Arabic have got placement offers with CTC Rs. 5.16 lakhs/annum plus perks in Amazon.

#### Office of the Controller of Examinations

#### **About the Examination system**

Examinations play an important role in imparting education and knowledge to students. It is an instrument to evaluate the depth of knowledge, understanding and extent of skill acquired by the student. For Teachers, examinations provide feedback to evolve their way of teaching.

The examinations at Aliah University are conducted semester-wise as the University follows the Semester system since its inception. There are two regular semesters in a year. The semester from July to December is known as the Autumn Semester or Odd-Semester and the semester from January to May is known as the Spring Semester or Even-Semester.

In general, a certain quantum of academic work, measured in terms of Credits, is the requirement to obtain a particular Degree as laid down in the Examination Rules. A student earns Credits by satisfactorily clearing Courses/Other academic activities in every Semester. The amount of Credits associated with a Course is dependent upon the number of hours of instruction per week in the Course. Similarly, the Credits associated with any of the Other activities are dependent upon the quantum of work expected to be put in for each of the Other activities per week.

Semester-wise performance assessment for every Course is done through various modes of examinations. Those include Quizzes/Class tests/Home assignments/Group assignments/Viva-voce and End-Semester Examination.

The assessment of a students' performance in a Theory Course is done through

- Internal assessment based on Quizzes/Assignments/Viva-voce etc. with 20% weightage
- The End-semester Examination covering the full syllabus of the course with 80% weightage.

The assessment in a Laboratory Course is based on

- Continuous assessment of 40% weightage
- Viva-voce examinations in regular laboratory classes with 10% weightage
- A semester-end Test with 50% weightage.

#### **Grading in the 10-point scale:**

The Grading system is based on the combined performance in all assessments. Students are awarded Letter Grades having definite numerical values i.e., Grade points in every Course taken by him/her in a particular Semester as per the Curriculum. Those Grade points are also equivalent to a particular range of Percentages of Marks.

The performance of a student in a Semester is indicated by a number called Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses enrolled by the student during the semester. The Courses which do not form the minimum requirement of the Degrees are not considered for calculation of the SGPA.

An up to date assessment of the overall performance of a student from the time s/he entered the University is obtained by calculating a number called Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), in a manner similar to the calculation of SGPA. The CGPA therefore considers all the Courses registered by the student towards minimum requirement of the Degree s/he has enrolled for an academic programme.

In addition to above Semester system, the UG Theology Programmes in some newly approved centres are being offered in conventional [1+1+1] system. The University is also offering BSc in Nursing programme under [1+1+1+1] system following the norms of Indian Nursing Council.

## **University Research Programme**

#### **A Brief Report**

The University Research Programme (URP) is a cell/section of the university which is functioning under the Board of Research Studies (BRS) of the University. This section is working with a Coordinator and a non-teaching staff. It takes care of all official matters related to the PhD, DSc, DLitt and LLD programmes running in Aliah University. This cell acts as a bridge between the students, faculties and the BRS. The URP Cell has a motto to provide and follow the right directions, rules and regulations formulated by UGC from time to time. URP Cell also assists in PhD admission process every year by following the latest UGC PhD & MPhil Regulations-2016/Aliah University Regulations-2017 for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), Doctor of Litt. (DLitt), Doctor of Sc. (DSc) and Doctor of Law (LLD). This cell guides the PhD scholars through the different stages of the programme, like submission of half-yearly progress, PhD topic registration seminar, thesis pre-submission seminar, open seminar cum viva-voce examination with the help of the Doctoral Scrutiny Committee (DSC) of each student and the Departmental Research Committee (DRC). Continuous discussion/analysis/meeting on various matters related to the improvement of the quality of research work related to PhD, DSc, DLitt, LLD is carried out with the BRS committee. Moreover, the URP cell is always active to help the students in participating in course work related to plagiarism-free document writing, research and publication ethics, etc. The URP cell ultimately follows the vision/goal of the university to provide high-quality research and development.

In 2018-2019 session, a total of eighteen (18) departments offered PhD programmes, such as Arabic, Bengali, English, Urdu, Education, Journalism and Mass Communication, Geography, Islamic Theology, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Statistics, Biological Sciences, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Management and Business Administration. Following UGC Regulation-2016/Aliah University Regulations-2017, URP Cell has conducted Aliah University Research Eligibility Test (AURET) for the admission of PhD students. Among the total number of applicants, almost 50% of students having NET/SET/GATE/MPhil have been exempted from AURET and called for direct interview cum viva-voce examination. The PhD students are selected for admission through discussion-based interview cum viva-voce examination. At the same time, Aliah University has awarded PhD degrees to the students who have successfully published research papers in UGC approved journals, presented research papers in seminars/conferences and successfully defended the thesis in open seminar cum viva-voce exam. The summary of the status of admission and award of PhD students in 2018 is given below:

- **About the Department:** The Department of English, Aliah University is still in its formative stage. Carrying the legacy of Aliah Madrasah, a 200 yrs. old educational institution that stressed on the need of teaching English to the Indian populace, this department is interestingly poised between the tradition of teaching British and American literature and an exciting future where the discipline has broadened its scope to include literatures of the world. The interests of the newly recruited faculty members reflect this rich diversity and range over Australian literature, Critical and Cultural theory, Dalit literature, Film Studies, Applied Linguistics, Shakespeare Scholarship, etc. Class room teaching bears the impress of the tradition of close textual analysis supported with interpretations within a theoretical framework at the post-graduate level. This is often supplemented by audio-visual means. Apart from formal lectures, there are tutorial classes and study groups which allow more personalised and productive interaction between the students and the faculty. Departmental Assessment of students is done through continual evaluation, End Semester examinations, terms papers and dissertations. The students of the department also partake of a vibrant cultural life on campus. The Department has organised seminars, workshops, special lectures in wide ranging topics that include Travel Writing, Cultural Studies, Renaissance Studies and Recent Trends in Indian Writing in English. #### 2. About the Department:

The Dept. of Islamic Theology is one of the earliest academic departments created after the upgradation of Calcutta Madrsah College to the status of a State University under the Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education, Government of West Bengal. In the beginning, the Department commenced its functioning in the Old Campus of Aliah University, erstwhile known as Calcutta Madrasah at 21, Haji Md. Mohsin Square, Kolkata-700016.

Aliah University — a State University under the Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education, Government of West Bengal — came into existence through the Aliah University Act (Act XXVII of 2007) passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly. The Act came into force on 5 April, 2008. However, its parent institution — from which it was upgraded to a University — was usually mentioned in various old Government records varyingly as Calcutta Mohomedan College or Calcutta Madrasah or Aliah Madrasah which was established by the British Governor-General Warren Hastings in 1780 at the request of some Muslim gentlemen of Calcutta.

The Calcutta Madrasa College which is the precursor of the Department of Islamic Theology originally imparted education based on the Dars-e-Nizami System with comprised of the subjects of Arabic grammar, Mantiq (Logic), Hikmat (Philosophy and Wisdom), Riadi (Mathematics), Haiat (Astronomy), Fiqh (Islamic Jurisprudence), Tafsir (Exegesis), and Hadith (Prophetic Traditions) which were strictly followed till the first two decades of 19th century.

The department of Islamic Theology is witnessing great increase in number of students. In the recent times the department is making giant strides in areas of teaching learning as well as in extra academic matters. The combination of tradition and modernity is reflected in the course structure, teaching methodology and in the pursuance of new and unique research. The department has partially shifted to the 8th floor of Park Circus campus in August, 2016. The department has 5 permanent faculty members, a good number of part time teacher and several non-teaching staff to run the department smoothly. The hard work and the sincerity of all concerned have made the department a vibrant one students of which participate in all the university events with active encourgement from the teachers.
