



Prof Muhammad Mumtaz Ali is a senior faculty member at the International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM), where he has been teaching since 1987. He specializes in Islamic Thought, Islamization of Knowledge, Philosophy of Science, and Civilizational Studies. A prolific author, his book Issues in Islamization of Human Knowledge which earned him the National Book Award in 2014 is widely regarded across academic circles. Prof Ali has presented papers in over 20 countries and serves as Chairman of both the Committee for Postgraduate Studies and Committee for Seminars in his department. His scholarship bridges classical Islamic knowledge with contemporary intellectual challenges.

The 21st century presents Muslims with unprecedented opportunities and challenges —ranging from technological innovation to global conflicts and ideological shifts. This module will examine how Islamic values can provide clarity and direction in the face of modern dilemmas. It will explore key issues such as Muslim youth identity, digital ethics, pluralism, and the role of faith in a secularising world. Through a reflective engagement with contemporary realities, participants will consider how to live as confident and constructive Muslims in the modern age.

Prof Dr Shukran Bin Abd Rahman

Prof Dr Shukran Abd Rahman is an accomplished academic in the field of Psychology with a specialization in Organisational and Industrial Psychology. He currently serves as the Dean of the Kulliyyah of Islamic Revealed Knowledge and Human Sciences at IIUM. He holds a Ph.D. from Murdoch University, Australia, and dual Bachelor's degrees in Islamic Revealed Knowledge and Human Sciences (Psychology) from IIUM. His academic and research interests span personnel psychology, organisational change and development, human resource development, and graduate employability. Prof. Shukran has contributed extensively to research and policy on higher education, leadership development, Islamic psychology, and values-based organisational behaviour. As a widely published scholar and recipient of multiple national awards, including the National Book Award and Outstanding Researcher Award. Prof. Shukran is also actively engaged in promoting Maqasid al-Shari'ah in institutional governance and education policy.

Islam and Multiculturalism







Prof M Afzal Wani is the Chairman of the Institute of Objective Studies and currently serves as Pro Vice-Chancellor and Dean at IILM University, Greater Noida. A former Professor and Dean at the University School of Law and Legal Studies, GGS Indraprastha University, New Delhi, Prof Wani brings over 33 years of experience in teaching and legal research. He has also served as a Member of the Law Commission of India (2009–2012) and as an elected member of the Governing Council of the Indian Law Institute. His academic interests span Jurisprudence, Comparative Law, Human Rights, Legal Research, and issues concerning women, children, and tribal communities. Prof Wani has authored/edited 14 books and published nearly 100 research papers. He has supervised 10 PhD scholars and has trained legal professionals both in India and abroad, including under the USAID Rule of Law Project for Afghanistan. He is a regular resource person for judicial training and editorial advisor to several academic journals.

Globalisation and Islam

This module will provide a critical Islamic assessment of globalisation—its economic, cultural, and ideological impacts—especially in relation to Muslim identity, ethics, and sovereignty. Participants will explore how Islamic principles can respond to issues such as consumerism, homogenisation of values, and cultural erosion. Non-Muslims under the Muslim Empires





Dr Muhammad Razi-ul-Islam Nadvi

Dr Muhammad Razi-ul-Islam Nadvi is a noted Islamic scholar, researcher and President of ITTI, Aligarh and currently serving as the Chief Editor of Tahqeeqāt-e-Islāmī, a reputed quarterly journal of Islamic research published from Aligarh. He received his Aalimiyat and Fazilat degrees from Darul Uloom Nadwatul Ulama, Lucknow, in 1981 and 1983 respectively. He later earned his BUMS and M.D. in Unani Medicine from Ajmal Khan Tibbiya College, Aligarh Muslim University. An accomplished author and translator, Dr. Nadvi has written extensively on Islamic theology, jurisprudence, and contemporary issues.

Islam as Faith and Civilization

Islam is not only a spiritual belief system but also a comprehensive civilization that has shaped the course of human history. This module will explore how Islamic values have informed governance, science, law, education, and the arts across centuries and cultures. From its origins in the Arabian Peninsula to its reach across Africa, Asia, and Europe, Islam developed into a civilization that embraced diversity, fostered knowledge, and upheld justice. The module will invite participants to reflect on the enduring relevance of Islamic civilization and the necessity of reviving its integrative spirit today.



Former Dean & Chairman, Dept of Sunni Theology, AMU, Aligarh

Prof Dr Taugeer Alam Falahi

Prof Dr Tauqueer Alam Falahi is former Dean and Chairman of the Department of Sunni Theology at Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh. A distinguished scholar of Qur'anic Studies, Arabic literature, and comparative religion, he holds an M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. in Arabic from AMU, where his doctoral research focused on The Holy Qur'an and the Orientalists. Earlier, he studied at Jamiatul Falah, Azamgarh, earning the degrees of al-'Ālimiyyah and al-Fāḍilah. He has authored 30 books in Urdu, Arabic, English, and Hindi, with several others forthcoming. His scholarly output includes 188 published research papers and participation in over 185 national and international seminars and conferences. He has served as a Visiting Professor at Mercer University, USA, and has been invited by academic and cultural institutions in the UK, Iran, Kuwait, and the USA.

Islamic Perspective of Knowledge

In Islam, knowledge ('ilm) is not merely the pursuit of information but a sacred duty that connects the human intellect to divine revelation. This module will examine the integrative nature of knowledge in Islam, where reason and faith, science and spirituality are seen as complementary. It will draw upon Islamic intellectual history and the example of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW) to highlight the transformative role of knowledge in individual and societal development. Islamic Perspective on Money and Wealth





The module also aims to provide counter-narratives to extremist ideologies by rooting the discourse in authentic Islamic teachings on peace-building.

Ageedah: Tawheed, Risalat and Akhirat



The Qur'an: The Universal Manifesto of Knowledge, Reflection and Ijtihad



In medicine, scholars like Ibn Sina, Al-Razi, and Al-Zahrawi compiled comprehensive texts, developed clinical practices, and introduced surgical tools and techniques still relevant today. Hospitals were established as centers for both healing and education. This session will explore how these achievements shaped modern science and exemplify a legacy of knowledge rooted in intellectual inquiry and Islamic values.





Islam and Environment



Development of Figh






